It is a place where these ladies will hear the Gospel being applied to areas where cultural beliefs and practices tend to supersede biblical



principles. Yes! Even among pastors' wives! They will learn how poverty directly correlates with abortion among leaders in the church, including lay members. And they will hear the heart of God concerning taking the life of an innocent person.

A 16-year-old girl who was six months pregnant walked to her local clinic and obtained abortion pills to end the pregnancy ... no questions asked. A pregnant woman at full term can walk into these clinics and receive the same service ... no questions asked.
