The road God asked Julie to travel

Many of you know how this ministry got started, but for those who don't, here is a short overview of how it came to be ... and why Julie cares so much.

Her mother died a few hours after childbirth and, as was the custom in Central African Republic, plans were to bury newborn Julie alive alongside her mother. Missionaries at a nearby clinic heard of Julie's predicament and came to her rescue.

The country's seemingly endless turmoil resulted in terrorists murdering Julie's brothers. When she met her husband, Cyrus, and they moved to the U.S., Julie thought she had left those dark days behind her. But in 2008, tragedy struck again.

Her youngest daughter asked permission to go swimming at a friend's house. She never came home; 10-year-old Irene drowned that day.

Out of this tragedy, Julie's Heart Cry was born. Today, Julie has turned that heartache into a ministry that God is using to protect unborn lives and help girls break free from the shackles of cultural traditions and poverty.
