COVID-19 compliance

Reopening during the pandemic was costly and challenging for schools throughout Uganda. Julie's Heart Cry supporters provided resources for the Good Samaritan Children's Center in Kampala, Blessed Steven's Hunter School in Luwero and Destiny Villages of Hope in Kantende so they could be compliant with COVID-19 health guidelines.

Your donations also paid for people to sew 2,500 masks, provided several infrared thermometers, gallons of liquid soap, multiple handwashing stations, hand sanitizer and so much more!

Because of you, the ministry also was able to provide 60 additional school benches for 300 preschoolers who were sitting on the floor or not attending classes at all because they didn't have enough seating.

Five young adults received business start-up equipment after they graduated from cosmetology, culinary and seamstress school.

We welcomed our first baby girl, Ann, from the displaced families since relocating to a safe community.
