Prayers, faithful giving make Kenya girls' home a reality

I am overjoyed to share a huge praise and answer to prayer with you this month! But first, I want to provide a little background about this project for those who may not be familiar with it.

Gladys Jerobon, a former professor at Kabarak University in Nakuru, Kenya, invited me to come speak to 2,000 high school students and more than 5,000 college university students on the topic of purity and the sanctity of life four years ago.

"Julie visited our university and shared powerfully to high school students and university students on purity and the urgency to rescue unborn babies," said Jerobon. "The topic of abortion is rarely spoken of in this part of the world. We seem

to prefer burying our heads in the sand of wickedness. Schoolgirls and university students get pregnant and seek to end the precious lives of their babies – and many, sadly, have stained their hands with innocent blood.

“Julie took the bull by the horns and not only addressed the topic boldly but also gave a solution – a home where pregnant girls can seek refuge, nurse their pregnancies and give birth in a safe place,” the educator continued. “This home will be a bright light shining into the dark, beamed by a woman of faith. She said she was going home to seek, knock, ask, and she would come back to make this a reality. We wait for her prayerfully, knowing it’s a spiritual war she is waging.”
